

### Code of conduct for parents/guardians

- Endeavour to ensure your child arrives promptly to their identified session(s) times, to reduce disruption within the gym.
- Ensure your child has been to the toilet before the start of the session
- Your child must be dressed appropriately for gymnastics, hair securely tied back and all Jewellery has been removed (British Gymnastics body piercing policy states protective taping of newly pierced ears, is permitted for the initial 6 weeks). A bag needs to be provided to enable your child to put their clothes in.
- It is compulsory that all gymnasts are provided with a suitable drink for their session
- You are responsible to continually check the clubs communications avenues, to stay informed of club information, such as cancellations, and events.
- Never punish a child in any form for poor performance. Value and congratulate on the positive elements, and recognise good performance, not just results.
- If you have any concerns please ensure these are directed to the club in the correct avenue, through speaking to the Head Coach or Welfare Officer.
- We have a zero tolerance on violence, and inappropriate language towards staff members, will not be tolerated.
- The club accepts no responsibility for left or lost items in the gym. Please make sure all items are clearly labelled.
- Establish and show good communication to the club, and keep us informed of any change in circumstances, which include changes in health, injuries, or any other issues that you feel we need to be aware of, which are relevant to your child.
- Respect coach's decisions that are made. Your child's well being, physical and mental development will be at the centre of all decisions.
- Inform the Head Coach at the earliest convenience if your child no longer wishes to attend, and keep the club informed of non attendance of sessions.
- Please do not enter the gym unless directed/agreed to by a member of the team.
- Ensure the club receives payment for your child's sessions(s) following the clubs guidelines on training fees.
